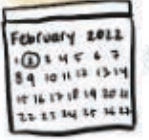

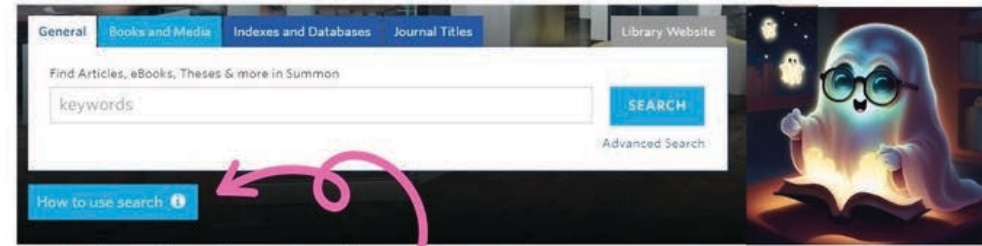
SUMMON

The library website search bar (aka **Summon**) searches most of UBC Library's collections.

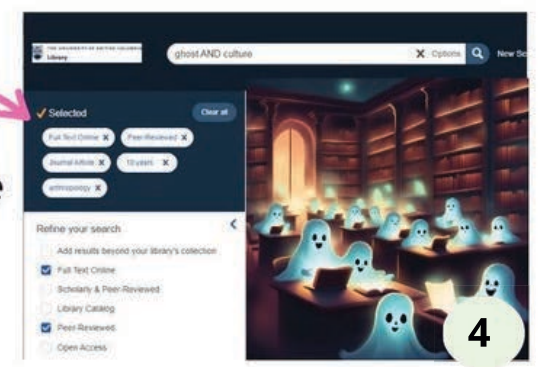


It's **spooky** how easily you can **Summon** amazing articles, books, and more at library.ok.ubc.ca!

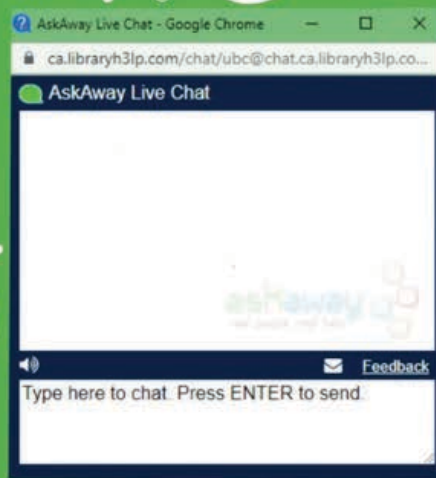

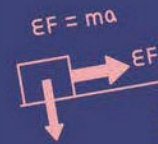

There are **subject librarians** for every department who can offer you one-on-one support via Zoom, in-person, or over email!



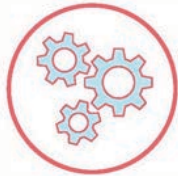

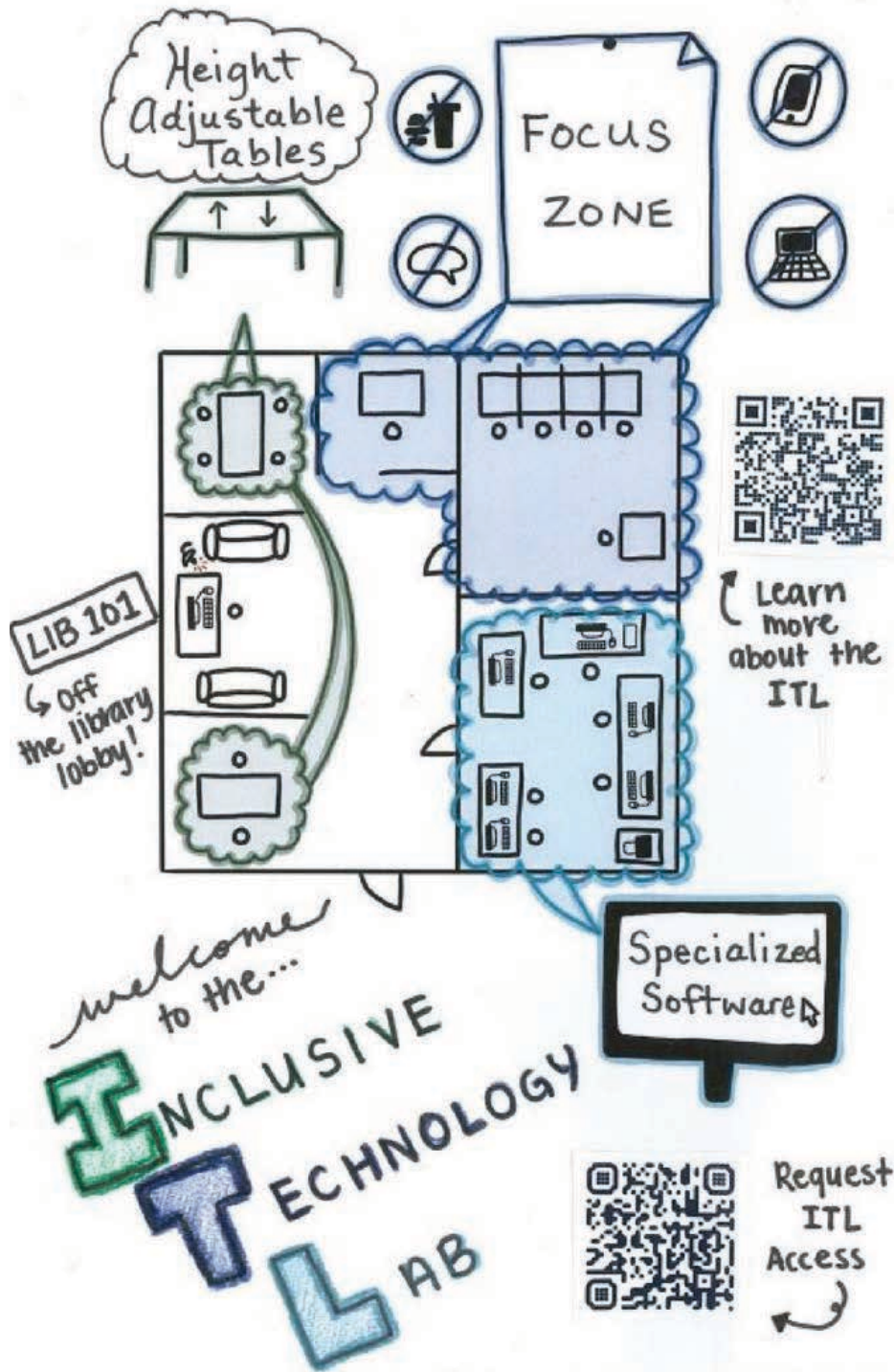

Our collections include archival records, photographs, audio-visual materials, ephemera, and published works of and about the Southern Interior of BC.

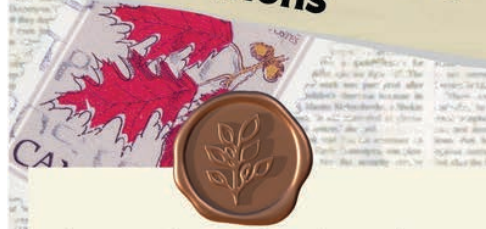

Search in the Library collection to see if we have a copy of your textbook or course readings

The library tries to purchase as many resources as possible, though some publishers don't sell e-textbooks to libraries

That's why Open Educational Resources are so important!

There are librarians, instructors, students, and staff who are advocating for open educational resources (OERs): **free teaching and learning materials.**

1) Find the book online through the UBC Library Catalogue

Go to the library homepage at library.ok.ubc.ca and enter the book title in the search bar:



Enter the book title in quotation marks to search it as a single term.

Filter by 'content type' and 'library location' in the left-hand menu to narrow search results

3) Grab the book from our library stacks

All books are located on the second floor of the library
