


SUMMON


Search in the Library collection to see if we have a copy of your textbook or course readings

1) Find the book online through the UBC Library Catalogue

Go to the library homepage at library.ok.ubc.ca and enter the book title in the search bar:



Enter the book title in quotation marks to search it as a single term.

Filter by 'content type' and 'library location' in the left-hand menu to narrow search results

Grab the book from our library stacks You'll use the listed call number to find where it's shelved.
